Refugee support - Nelson receives refugees from Myanmar (Burmese) and Bhutan (Bhutanese and Nepalese). In fact there are 400 of the former and 200 of the latter already in Nelson with approximately 8 new families being received every month. The Red Cross in Nelson coordinate support and there are needs we as churches in the region can meet. Brightwater parish are helping the Red Cross with providing for some of these families. They have already started to coordinate a 3-month gift to several new families from Burma of weekly fruit and vegetable boxes. The next project is to help the new influx of 4 families arriving in mid-June. These families will need things like rice cookers and towels, and pillows.
