Earlier in the letter he writes "everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have discarded everything else, counting it all as garbage, so that I could gain Christ and become one with him." Phil 3:8

Materially most of us we can get whatever we want. We are more than satisfied. But how satisfied are we with the spiritual lack in the lives of those around us? Question to self: Do I care enough to discard everything else in order to help others to gain Christ?
