Prayers for the Week

World – We pray for Yemen where an estimated 8 million people are on the brink of famine and civilian deaths have increased dramatically in recent months. Bless the efforts of all who seek to bring peace, especially for success for the UN initiative for peace talks in Stockholm next month.

We pray also for the thousands of migrants massing on the US/Mexico border. Help governments to get to grips with this growing problem and to react with both justice and compassion.

We also think of the damaging forest fires in California, where so far over 80 people have died and over 11,000 homes are known to have been destroyed by the fire, as well as over 3,000 commercial properties.
