

Releasing the Kingdom

Our guest speakers, Kevin and Anne Roberts, have described God's Kingdom as:

- within us
- coming in the future when Jesus comes back again to the earth
- and around us in the world.

The Lord is in the business of transforming us by the power of his Spirit, not just so we can be better people, but so that we can work more effectively in releasing his Kingdom here on earth.

What a privilege it is to be part of this. The Kingdom is primarily released when we are out in God's World, rather than hiding in the church. Over the last week we've been considering all the contacts we have in the community.

I wonder how many people you connect with each day. Have you ever listed them all? Family, neighbours, shop staff, work colleagues, friends, people in our social groups and clubs, our doctor and other professionals – what a wonderful list we each have, of opportunities to show God's love.

Each one of us has far more influence than we often think

Let's be very intentional about exerting that influence for the expansion of God's Kingdom. If we begin each day asking the Lord to alert us to the opportunities we have, we are more likely to see those opportunities. If we ask him to help us to do what he wants with those opportunities, we are more likely to act on them. If we ask him to give us words that connect with the people we come across, we are more likely to speak those words.

Releasing the Kingdom is probably not about doing a whole lot more than we are already doing. It is probably more about simply making the most of what we already have, while being open to new contacts and new relationships.

At the AGM before last, Simon Martin asked us "What do you have in your hand?" What connections do you already have? How would the Lord like to strengthen and enhance those connections? What conversations might the Lord be asking you to initiate? How does he want to release the Kingdom through you and I; and through our church?
