

Notices from Anglican Missions - We wish to advise that we are supporting the recently launched CWS Appeal for Rohingya refugees arriving in Bangladesh and those needing help in Myanmar. More than half a million Rohingyas have crossed the border from Myanmar into Bangladesh in the last six weeks in what the United Nations is now calling a “textbook example of ethnic cleansing”. They join hundreds of thousands who have already fled. Those who have fled, those who have been left behind and the host communities in Bangladesh exist in precarious circumstances. The UN estimates that 1.2 million people now need support. This is a truly tragic situation that will only worsen. Christian World Service has an appeal for Rohingya refugees that supports those who have arrived in Bangladesh and those still needing help in Myanmar. What we need is continued prayer for the isolated and lonely in our community; that they will have the boldness to come along to our centre so that our amazing team can show them Gods love.
