Our Everlasting Father has been honoured by the lives of those I have mentioned and millions more that I don't even know of. My prayer is that our lives continue to point people towards his love and faithfulness – as long as we have breath.

Prayers for the Week

God's World - We pray for those civilians who are trapped in Aleppo and Mosul, open up the ways for them to safely leave and to receive the essentials they need for life. Grant a change in the hearts of those on all sides of the conflict to put compassion before military gain. In Mosul, we pray for help to reach the seventy-two thousand who have fled so far, especially for warm accommodation, as winter has brought freezing temperatures. We continue to pray for all those who have suffered loss of homes and livelihoods in the recent earthquakes, particularly those in the Kaikoura and Awatere parishes and in the Aceh province of Indonesia. Give wisdom to central and local government as they plan major repair works to restore communications and services to those badly affected. We also ask for guidance for the choosing of a new Prime Minister and deputy. May the process be respectful with a healthy result.

Mission Partners - We pray for the Corin family in Asia, for the micro-loan programme that they are starting in a new part of the country – that Chris would make contacts with the right people to make this a success, and through supporting pastors and church planters through this project, that the church will grow in this new region. We pray for wisdom for Catherine as she balances teaching at school and continuing to spend time with the local ladies she has been meeting with, may these relationships deepen as You bring Your light.

Diocese - We pray for the parish of Tahunanui with Nathaniel and Simone Petterson and their vibrant team. Bless and encourage their children's and teen's ministries and the 'Christmas in Tahuna' programme, that they would reach people with the message of Jesus. We pray for discernment and clear leading in the appointment of the new Community Pastor, that the right person would be appointed and for Your blessing on this new ministry when it begins next year.

Local community - We pray today for Richmond Catholic Church with Father Seph Pijfers, help the church to maintain a sense of unity with the amalgamation of the Richmond, Motueka and Takaka parishes. Bless Merrick Mitchell in his role as lay pastoral leader for the three parishes, especially as he prepares for his formal installation in this role at the end of January.
