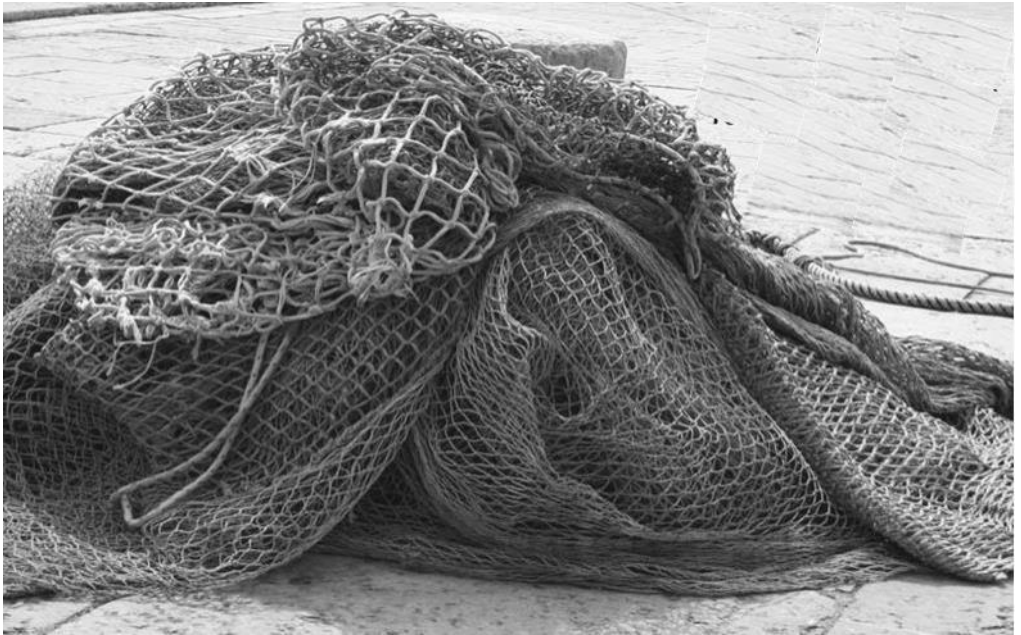




Holy Trinity Church

Our mission partners we thank you for the Corin family in Asia, help them to encourage new and young believers in the faith; give them wisdom in their opportunities for sharing their faith; bless their own children in their studies and their own developing relationships with You.
