

Ly Peng is one of the key students in Phil's dental outreach team in his church based community clinics and had committed to the prison team. Phil's prison team has started working every Wednesday. With Ly Peng withdrawing they are short on student volunteers. The community clinics have been going really well with the pastors at each church being fully involved and supportive. In the most recently started clinic, the pastor has been really excited about the team coming. Phil recently arrived to find him running evangelistic outreach to the patients who had arrived for treatment!

Diocese: Thank you Generous God for the recent arrival of Rev.d Russell and Anna Pickersgill-Brown into the Motueka Parish. Russell asks us to pray for unity in leadership and vision for your purpose, and also for individuals to experience the reality of your love.
